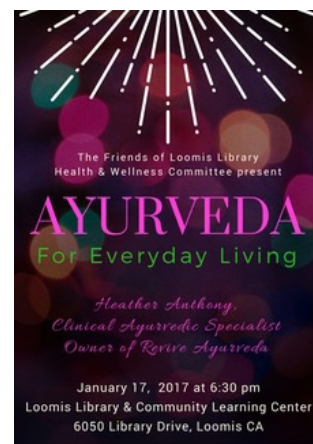

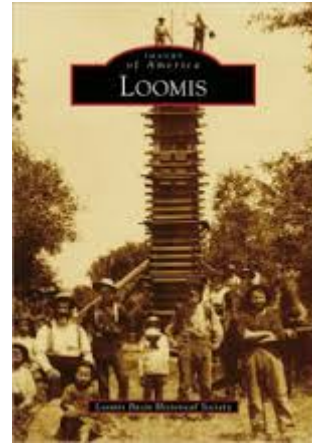

We received funding and the opportunity to work with an Encore Fellow through a partnership with Intel and the American Leadership Forum, Mountain Valley Chapter.



Our Fellow, Eric Shen, graduated from UC Davis with a Bachelor Degree in Electrical Engineering and recently retired from Intel after nearly 30 years of service. He worked in different roles and areas during his career.

He also has an MBA and is currently working towards a Masters in Computer Science through Georgia Tech. After he completes his fellowship at the Loomis Library & Community Learning Center in August 2017, Eric will return to the private sector. 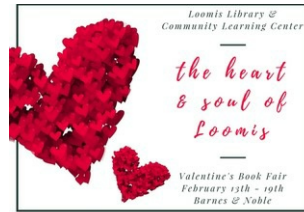

Your Loomis Library & Community Learning Center is the heart and soul of our Town. Please mark your calendars for a Valentine's

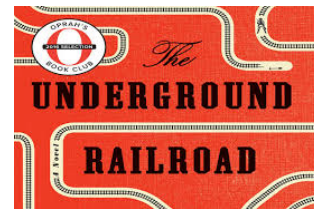


book fair we'll be doing through Barnes & Noble stores.
