We have much to celebrate and many people to thank, but most importantly, ***The Loomis Library and Community Learning Center*** continues to move forward.

Placer County approved a 10-year lease agreement with the Town of Loomis that's contingent on the passage of a 1/4 cent transaction and use tax measure in the November election. Until then, Placer County Library Services will operate the Loomis Library past the June 30, 2016 deadline so the summer reading program can continue running through the end of July. We thank them for this service to our community.

The Loomis Library will be closed to the public July 30 - Aug 31st so a transition can be made. We'll keep everyone posted on the reopening date and where meetings, workshops and events will take place during the month of August.

We are grateful to the Ad Hoc committee for working hard and diligently throughout the year to research and develop alternate solutions. We are deeply grateful to Rick Angelocci, Loomis Town Manager, for his patience, leadership and valuable insight in guiding this process and developing a solid, viable plan.

Thank you to the Loomis Town Council for listening to the community, supporting the needs of the residents and letting the Loomis voters decide if they will support funding of the Library and Community Learning Center in November.

Most importantly, thank you to the Loomis Library supporters without whose support none of this would be possible.

There are still obstacles to overcome and a great deal of hard work in front of us, but today we celebrate. This is a huge accomplishment and we are grateful to be part of this community.

Come join the FOLL Workshops!



We have amazing residents in our community! While we've been busy trying to save our library, some pretty talented folks came to us to donate their time and services at no cost. We are tremendously grateful!!!


NASA Solar System Ambassador Steven Ainsworth
